EARTH DAY TURNS 50

2020 marks the 50th anniversary of Earth Day

1970 THE FIRST EARTH DAY

Earth Day founder Gaylord Nelson developed the idea for a national day to focus on the environment after he witnessed the massive oil spill in Santa Barbara, California, in 1969.

On April 22, 1970, 20 million Americans — at the time, 10% of the total population of the United States — took to the streets, parks and auditoriums to demonstrate for a healthy, sustainable environment in massive coast-to-coast rallies.

1990 EARTH DAY GOES GLOBAL

Earth Day 1990 gave a huge boost to recycling efforts worldwide and helped pave the way for the 1992 United Nations Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro.

1992 ENVIRONMENTAL FUND FOR GEORGIA ESTABLISHED

This fund (now EarthShare Georgia) was created by environmental groups in Georgia wanting representation in workplace-giving.
